Scott Elliott from Maneki Neko Gardens in Ellabell, Georgia will be our speaker. Scott and Dominique Elliott specialize in double, spider, and unusual form daylilies that will grow well over a wide geographical area. In addition, they hybridize a large number of small and miniature daylilies. Their daylilies are grown in southeast Georgia but also tested in Wisconsin. All daylilies are field grown and never enter a greenhouse. As of last year, they had registered 111 daylilies and won a number of awards.

Scott is currently President of AHS region 5. He is the 2017 Chair of the Judges' Education Committee and Chair of the AHS Scientific Studies Committee. He is also the author of the recently published *Double Daylilies:* Twice the Fun. Scott is the Co-Chair of the 2020 AHS National Convention being held in Savannah, GA.

About Our Speaker

Maneki Neko Gardens in Ellabell, Georgia, is located on 11 acres in a country setting. Scott and Dominique Elliott grow more than 90 varieties of hydrangeas and too many daylilies to count. As far as daylilies go, they specialize in show-winning double, spider and unusual form daylilies and any combination of the above with an emphasis on daylilies that will grow well over a wide geographical area. Scott and Dominique also hybridize a large number of small and miniature daylilies, and a few extra large dayilies, usually by mistake. Basically, they work with any form of daylily, except large, fluffy, full-form singles. Their daylilies are grown in Southeast Georgia, and are tested in Wisconsin. All daylilies are field grown and NEVER enter a greenhouse. Tender seedlings are allowed to die and are eliminated from the program.

111 daylilies, earning 48 AHS Achievement Medals, 12 Junior Citations, the Georgia Doubles Appreciation award, the Georgia Hybridizers award, two Honorable Mention awards and the Ida Munson award. In addition, both Scott and Dominique have won the Ophelia Taylor Horticultural award. Scott and Dominique also compete in a number of daylily shows each year, earning seven best-inshow awards for their own cultivars in 2015-2016. In addition to their own registered cultivars, they grow approximately 200 named cultivars from other hybridizers, mostly used for their hybridizing program. The remaining

few thousand daylilies are, for the most part,

seedlings in some stage of development.

Scott is a noted speaker with fun, entertaining and informative programs on a number of topics. He travels in excess of 100,000 miles a year giving presentations all over the world. Scott is the 2017 Chair of the Judges' Education Committee and Chair of the AHS Scientific Studies Committee, in addition to being on a number of committees ranging from Membership, Publications and the Popularity Poll. He is also the author of the recently published Double Daylilies: Twice the Fun and continues to publish articles in the Daylily Journal and various Regional newsletters.
