Join us on **Tuesday, August 1, 6:30pm** for our program entitled: "Hook, Line, & Sinkers: An Iris Seed Survival Strategy" by Steve Poole from Eldorado, IL. Steve is an iris hybridizer and comes from a family of gardeners. He received his first irises as a gift for his eighth birthday. Steve joined the American Iris Society in 1969 and has had several tall bearded introductions. Expect an interesting iris talk! As noted in the last newsletter, a Bylaw change is being recommended for the Nominating Committee. The following (in red) revision is suggested and will be voted on at the August 1 meeting:

"NOMINATING--This committee consists of three (3) members who shall be appointed by the President at the April meeting. It is recommended that officer positions be filled with those who have been members of IDIS for at least two (2) years when possible. The Chairman shall announce the slate of nominees at the June Membership meeting. Nominations may also be made from the floor at the June meeting, however, those nominees must be present at the meeting to accept the nomination. The Chairman shall present a slate of nominees for officers again at the August Membership meeting for election by a two-thirds vote of the members present."

As noted in the Bylaws, the slate of officers will be presented for election at the August meeting. Tamara Mitman has withdrawn her name as treasure nominee. Tom Bohn has agreed to continue as treasurer another year. The slate will include President--Rod Maust, First Vice-President--Laurel Richardson, Second Vice-President--Alex Sutherland, Corresponding Secretary--Jeanette Blackstone, Recording Secretary--Lezlie Myers, Treasurer--Tom Bohn, Advisor/Past President--John Everitt. All officers will require a two-thirds vote of the members present.

Tamara is also requesting to be relieved of the Property Committee responsibilities. She has been storing IDIS supplies in her garage in about a 4'X8' space. If anyone is able to store our supplies, please let me know. Special thanks to Tamara for storing the supplies for several years!

Registrations prior to 2006: \$5.00 for double fan. Registrations 2006 and after: Average Lily Auction price dropped to the next amount divisible by 5 (Ex. average Lily Auction price of \$12 becomes \$10)

'Stella de Oro': \$3.00/small clump of multiple fans. Plus, bring a couple double fans of very recent intros (and

thus priced more than \$10) for the connoisseurs' table.

Donate at least 10 plants or work a minimum of 4 hours and

earn credits toward the NCAP and Registration Reimbursement programs.

DON'T FORGET TO WEAR YOUR IDIS SHIRT!!

Bring your lunch and drinks in a small cooler. IDIS will provide water bottles on ice. We will be in Sullivan's greenhouse again as last year. No worries about rain!

How to access daylily prices on the Lily Auction:

To find the auction site for a daylily of 2006 or after (pre-2006 intros are all \$5), Google "lily auction" and select "the Lily Auction." Select "Register" and set up an account if you don't already have one. Once registered, type in cultivar name in either the Search CLOSED space (top right) or the Search OPEN space (top left). Hit enter and wait a few seconds. A record of either past sales in the CLOSED section, or current bids on an OPEN sale will be displayed. Look at the prices for DF (double fan) and

estimate an "average price" (no need to resort to a calculator!) Drop to nearest amount divisible by 5 and there's your IDIS sale price! (If no results pop up for a particular cultivar, you can try the hybridizer's website for a price **OR** you can wait and pricing will be done at the sale.

IDIS members will receive an automatic 10% discount on purchases at the daylily and iris sale. No coupon needed!

NOTE: If there are leftover plants from the combined sale (hopefully we will be sold out), we will need volunteers to pot up 10 plants each and foster them over the winter (will qualify for NCAP credit in 2018. These plants will be sold at an IDIS booth at a Master Gardener's sale in April.

NCAP Daylilies due in Sept.

Due Sept. 9 at Pitch-in First Friends Church, 3030 Kessler Blvd.

Given out in 2014, these NCAP daylilies from hybridizers Tom Polston and Guy & Karen Pierce

are due to be returned this year. Those listed as (due in 2016) were kept over from last year and should be

returned this year. Keep a double fan and bring the increases to be auctioned off to members. Please bring your plants in a bag with your name on

it with each double fan clearly labeled. The NCAP auction is the best chance members have

NEW FORMAT FOR PLANT INFO AT SALE

We'd like to give our daylily sale a uniform look while at the same time making it easier for customers to see what flowers are available.

Below is a photo of the set up. What you see is an information sheet and photo clipped to a small stand that uses our small show containers. These will be set behind the boxes holding the plants.


To accommodate cultivars with only two or three double-fans, the plants can be combined in the same box backed by a large poster where several info sheets and photos can be displayed. With help from members who come to help set up, these can be done quickly the day of the sale.
