Greeting Gardening Friends,

What a fluctuating winter we've had! With the widely varying temperatures, I had some iris heave out of the ground since they were planted late in the year, but I trust they'll find a way to survive.

Laurel has lined up some interesting speakers again this year and we will open with a presentation by Greg Beavers on "Bluebirds in your garden". He'll show us a few pictures of his flower beds and then talk about bluebirds: their habitat, design and placement of nesting boxes, how to control predators, how to attract them, etc. He'll also have a few nesting boxes for sale for those interested. An interesting topic as we think about our flower beds in the larger context of the garden biome.

A new experience this year will be a booth at the Flower and Patio Show from March 9-17 at the State Fairgrounds. It's considered an educational booth so we'll have our flyers on growing daylilies and iris. There will also be a few potted iris plants for sale even though they are dormant. I'm looking for volunteers to help staff the booth. This would just involve talking with the public about your experience growing these plants. The show runs from 10am to 8pm every day except Sundays which are 10am to 5pm. If you could volunteer for a morning (10am-3pm) or afternoon (3pm-8pm) shift, it would be appreciated. (Sundays could be 10am-2pm or 1pm to 5pm). This is a qualifying event toward the NCAP and registration refund programs. One is welcome to volunteer for a shorter time as well if a full shift doesn't work for your schedule. There are free parking passes

and entrance passes available for volunteers. It should be a fun event. Please let me know if you can volunteer.

Another change we're trying this year involves the fall banquet. Our attendance has been low at recent banquets and it has been suggested that we try another format. We will be having a pitch-in picnic, (possibly at Eagle Creek Park) on **Sunday**, October 6th. Instead of recruiting an outside speaker and having a catered meal, we will be using our funds to purchase both day-lilies and iris plants to give away to attending members. We will still have the show award winners announced as well as installation of the officers. There will be more information about the event later in the year.

As you all know, Emily Poor graciously donated Jim's daylilies to our club. These were dug last summer by John Everitt, Dan Howell, and Tom Bohn. About half of them will be offered at our August plant sale. However as club members, we will get first choice on buying his plants. John has made a PDF of Jim's daylilies, along with an order form. Please review the list, fill out the order form, and bring it to the March or April meeting. Give the order form and your payment to Tom Bohn. Your plants will be brought to the May meeting. This means we can get the daylilies planted yet this spring and won't need to wait until the August sale. Thanks John for this early sale opportunity!

At our March business meeting, we will review and pass a budget for this year. Please review the budget and if you have any questions about it, feel free to talk with Tom or me beforehand.

We have also been asked by the AIS Region 6 if we would host the September 19, 2020 fall regional meeting. It is usually held in the Fort Wayne area because of its central location for the region. The board has endorsed accepting this assignment upon approval of the membership. Four members have already vol-
