Greeting Gardening Friends,

I hope everyone has been safe and healthy as we've faced this pandemic. We're not out of the woods yet, but are headed in the right direction. I'm hopeful that 2021 will allow us to resume some of our past activities again. Mary Vinson has lined up our speakers this year and she was able to reschedule some from 2020. Even though the vaccine has been rolling out, it will be a while before everyone can get it. The Indiana Flower & Patio Show which had been scheduled for March has been cancelled until 2022. To be on the safe side, our first meeting on March 2 will be via Zoom. Laurel has graciously offered to host the Zoom meeting with her account. If you are not familiar with Zoom, please contact Laurel the week before the meeting so she can walk you through a practice run. This will facilitate starting our meeting on time and easing the log on process.

Our own Bret Clement will be speaking at our March meeting on "Hoosier Bred Daylilies". Bret maintains a garden at his residence on a relatively small lot in Carmel where he grows approximately 1000 registered varieties for hybridizing purposes and his personal enjoyment. He has completed his move of introductions and seedlings to Gregg and Linda Sutter's farm about 45 minutes northwest of Indianapolis. He notes that the soil there appears to be better than at his old location and many of his introductions that were moved performed significantly better. Bret has over 200 registered daylilies and remains active at hybridizing. His focus has been on both tetraploid and diploid unusual forms and spiders, as well as round and ruffled tetraploid forms.

The main item of business for our March meeting will be the review and approval of the 2021 budget. Please review the attached budget before the meeting. If you have any questions about a line item, contact Tom Bohn or me. We will be able to view the budget on Zoom and folks will be able to make comments/ask questions during the meeting. Be sure to also look over the 2021 calendar of events as it includes both regional and national meetings which you may want to attend.

Since COVID limited us to only two meetings during 2020, your IDIS membership for 2020 is being carried over for 2021. So if you paid your dues for a 2020 membership, you won't
